# Second Belt and Road Summit Opens Next Monday Government Officials and Business Leaders along Belt and Road Economies to Attend Summit

**5 September 2017 –** The second Belt and Road Summit, jointly organised by the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) and the Hong Kong Trade Development Council (HKTDC), will be held on 11 September at the Hong Kong Convention an Exhibition Centre (HKCEC).

The event's second edition is also one of the highlight events celebrating the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the HKSAR. Under the theme "**From Vision to Action**," this year's summit will spotlight topical issues such as infrastructure investment and prospects for ASEAN, while young entrepreneurs will also offer their views on the Belt and Road Initiative.

Mrs Carrie Lam, Chief Executive of the HKSAR Government; Ning Jizhe, Vice Chairman, National Development and Reform Commission of the People's Republic of China and Gao Yan Vice Minister, Ministry of Commerce, the People's Republic of China, will deliver keynote speeches at the opening session. 


## 展覽廳 5F-G 主論壇場地 Halls 5F-G Main Room
